

On Wednesday 3rd June 2020, the Network contacted Sheena Griffiths – Equality and Diversity Adviser and Jo Duberley, the Deputy Pro-Vice

Chancellor for Equalities, Diversity and Inclusion. Natasha Nelson wrote:

I was actually really disappointed that the University didn't post anything on social media or via email yesterday to staff and students. A number of universities have also published their statements on their webpages too. I saw lots of other universities, and know a fair few also sent all staff/student emails out. Yesterday was obviously #blackouttuesday and #blackoutday2020 and was the day that the most activity and content was pushed out to have the most impact.

Emails went back and forth and a statement from the Deputy Pro—Vice Chancellor was forwarded to the co-chairs of the Network. We felt strongly that it did not provide a powerful message of support. We have been asked to work together to produce further statements. In the meantime, we felt it was important to take action for ourselves and we could best do this by sending out this update.
