### TransEDU website for HE and FE

The <u>TransEDU website</u> has been developed recently to provide open-access resources, guidance and training materials regarding trans people in the Education Sec-

tor. Since July 2016, Dr Mckendry and Dr Lawrence at the University of Strathclyde have been



conducting research, funded by the Scottish Funding Council, on the experiences of transgender, non-binary and gender diverse people in colleges and universities, to provide information and data for the website. TransEDU is now a central resource for information on supporting trans applicants, students and staff in HE and FE.

Microvolunteering is defined as 'bite-sized, ondemand, no commitment actions that benefit a worthy cause'.
