
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## Community Day 2013

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### Staff pay update

The support staff pay round for 2012 was delayed because of Unison's dispute over the 2011 pay settlement. Pay negotiations for 2012 did not begin therefore until December 2012. The current position is that the support staff unions are consulting with their members over a revised offer. A response is expected by 12 April. If the offer is accepted at that point, the new rates and back pay (to August 2012) could be implemented in May.
