
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Vice-Chancellor's distinguished lecture: Rolf-Dieter Heuer

Venue: Elgar Concert Hall, Bramall Music Building

Professor Rolf–Dieter Heuer, Director-General at CERN, will give this lecture titled *'The search of a deeper understanding of our universe at the Large Hadron Collider: the World's Largest Particle Accelerator'*. CERN is the home of the Large Hadron Collider, a 27 kilometre long tunnel where physicists from all over the world are learning about the nature of matter and the beginning of the universe by colliding particles together at high energies under conditions that would have existed only a millionth of a second after the Big Bang.
