New £6.8 million biomedical hub to open at Birmingham Research Park

The University is investing £3.4 million in a new biomedical hub after winning match-funding from the European Development Fund. The facility, due to open next summer at Birmingham Research Park on Vincent Drive, will provide laboratory and office space for new, and growing, biomedical businesses in the local area. HR Excellence Award success

Congratulations to colleagues in Human Resources who have achieved the European Commission's HR Excellence in Research Award, which acknowledges their commitment to researcher development. The Award demonstrates a university's commitment to improving the working conditions and career development for research staff, which will in turn improve the quantity, quality and impact of research for the benefit of UK society and the economy. Birmingham is one of only 15 UK universities to retain the award after their two-year review.

Success for Academic Practice Team

The Academic Practice Team had a great 2012–13 academic year. They welcomed 1,019 attendees to Introduction to Teaching and Learning workshops aimed at postgraduates who teach. The Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice course is also growing strong with 12 participants graduating from the programme and 92 participants currently enrolled. A newly formed Business Engagement team, within Development, Alumni, and Business Engagement (DABE), is tasked with enabling interaction between the University and industry, promoting knowledge exchange, and developing mutually beneficial relationships. Birmingham-Nottingham Strategic Collaboration

In March 2011, the Universities of Birmingham and Nottingham signed a historic framework agreement for collaboration. As part of this, [the Birmingham Nottingham Strategic Collaboration fund](#) was launched in Autumn 2012. Following the success of the first three rounds, a further call will take place with a deadline of 17 January 2014. Two streams of funding are available: Creativity funding will support projects which seek to create the foundations for new collaborations. Accelerator funding will support projects that build on existing relationships to forge significant, sustainable activities to deliver a genuine impact for both institutions. Funding is available for research and knowledge transfer projects as well as teaching and professional services initiatives to drive improvements in performance in all areas of the universities' missions.
