This programme equips you to utilise, analyse and interpret the big data sets that are increasingly available across health systems, and to understand these in the context of health and economic related issues and policy. It is designed for economics graduates and graduates of other quantitative disciplines looking to pursue a career in health economics, or professionals (also with an economics-based degree) in the health-related sector who wish to develop skills in health economics.



- Receive advanced technical training in examining health issues from an economics perspective, thereby developing your analytical skills for use in health economics
- Build your analytical ability to relate theories and research findings to your current or future employment experience
- Gain an understanding of the theoretical and historical foundation of health economics
- Develop your skills in the application of research evidence in the field of health economics
- Enhance your understanding of the role of health economics in health care decision-making

More about the course

In addition to the core modules, you will choose between the Statistics for Health Economics II module, plus any 10-credit module offered as part of the Masters in Public Health Programme or a 20 credit module in Applied Econometrics.

For the full Masters programme, you will need to submit a dissertation on an agreed topic in an area of health economics or econometrics.

In contrast to the long-established MSc Health Economics and Health Policy programme, this programme provides a greater focus on the underpinning advanced economic theory and econometrics for students with a background in economics or a related discipline.

World-class learning and teaching

As a University of Birmingham student, you will have the privilege of learning from world-leading academics, practitioners and researchers, who will challenge and encourage you to become an independent and self-motivated learner within the context of your professional role.

Department of Economics modules are delivered in traditional weekly lectures and classes, while Health Economics Unit modules are delivered via block sessions of three or five days. Learning is via a wide range of teaching styles such as lectures, workshops, presentations, peer group learning, self-study, etc. You will also have access to a personal tutor and the College Graduate School for support, advice and information.
