



LOCATION

Studying here, you will enjoy the best of both worlds: a beautiful, historic, green campus that is just a few minutes away from the heart of an exciting, modern city. With our own railway station on campus, you can be in the city centre in less than eight minutes. There is something for everyone in Birmingham, and you are sure to receive a warm welcome in one of the most culturally diverse cities in Britain.

SHOPPING

The city centre offers a first-class retail experience; from famous brands to independent stores, Birmingham has something for everyone. You will find a wealth of choice, from large shopping centres like Bullring, Selfridges, Mailbox and Grand Central, to diverse vintage clothing stores and artisan workshops in the world-famous Jewellery Quarter.

FOOD

Birmingham is filled with foodies, which means new restaurants and food festivals are always popping up across the city. The multi-award-winning Digbeth Dining Club hosts independent food stalls, with pop-ups across the city, while our very own farmers' market on campus offers locally sourced and environmentally friendly produce. Our independents regularly host events across the city, including day and night markets, pop-ups and collaborations; all helping you to discover new favourites.

CULTURE

THE **EXCHANGE**

In September 2021, we opened The Exchange. Located in Centenary Square, The Exchange uses our research, teaching, and local, national and international networks to create a hub within our city centre for education, events and celebration.

UNIVERSITY ACCOMMODATION

Our dedicated postgraduate accommodation is located across our three student villages: Vale Village, Selly Oak Village and Pritchatts Park Village; all of which are within walking distance of the Edgbaston campus.



To secure your place in University-owned accommodation you will need to make an advance rent payment of £550 at the time of booking. This is deducted from your residence fees.



TRAVELLING TO AND FROM CAMPUS

There are several ways to travel to our campus. From bike lanes to canal paths, we are well connected to many areas of our city.

Birmingham Cycle Revolution is making cycling easier. A 4km, fully segregated cycleway links Selly Oak and the University with the city centre. Completed in January 2019, the cycleway provides a safe, healthy and green method of travelling around the city.

Our campus is also well served by bus routes, with the 61, 63, X21 and X22 services running frequently from the city centre. From Moseley, the 1A stops right outside the University and from Harborne, the 48 and 244 provide services which drop you close to the University.

As we have our own railway station, University, you can get regular trains travelling from Birmingham New Street to campus in under eight minutes, making trips to and from the city centre quick and easy.

VALE VILLAGE

Just a 15-minute walk from campus, The Vale is set in a beautiful lakeside parkland. Studios and studio apartments are available for postgraduate students. A bar, restaurant, café, convenience store and laundrette contribute to a community atmosphere so you feel right at home.

SELLY OAK VILLAGE

A five-minute walk from campus, with the vibrant Selly Oak high street on your doorstep. Our postgraduates are located together in Jarratt Hall, which offers en-suite rooms with shared kitchens. Prices are approximately £161 per week. This is the perfect environment to make new friends while allowing you time to concentrate on your studies.

PRITCHATTS PARK VILLAGE

Close to campus, Harborne and University station, Pritchatts Park provides self-catering accommodation for postgraduates in a lovely landscaped setting. The Village's design creates a sense of community, with shared facilities such as meeting rooms, an airy lounge, a quiet study zone and a games room offering the perfect environment to get to know your fellow postgraduates. Prices start from £115 per week.



If you are studying at the Shakespeare Institute, there are many sources of accommodation in Stratford-upon-Avon and we will give you as much assistance as we can to help you find somewhere to live nearby.

Close to campus

Selly Oak is the closest residential area, just a five-minute walk from the University campus. The weekly cost of rent ranges from £75-£140, usually excluding utilities.

Host Student Apartments are located just a
few minutes' walk from campus, with prices
starting from £184 per week. The Metalworks
sits right on the edge of campus and offers a
variety of rooms, with prices starting from
£164 per week.

Across the road from campus on the Bristol Road, studios are available at the Battery Park and Athena Studios sites, with prices starting from £224 per week.

LIFE ON CAMPUS

Our campus has undergone a huge transformation, redeveloping the campus and facilities to support your success. From outstanding new accommodation to new teaching and learning facilities, students at Birmingham benefit daily from our new developments.

Our Green Heart offers lush new parkland in the centre of campus. Measuring over 12 acres, it provides a unique space for performances, socialising, meeting and studying.

Our main library houses state-of-the-art facilities for students, staff and researchers. It is a modern space providing informal seating, group study spaces and individual desks alongside a wealth of new technology, including wireless mobile charging, media rooms and video editing booths. Whether you are working in groups or independently studying, our library has the perfect facilities for learning.

Alongside our main library, you can find further facilities throughout our Colleges. Supporting the Arts, Shakespeare Studies and the Dental and Medical Schools, our libraries offer additional study spaces and resources to further your development.

MAIN LIBRARY

Away from our main campus...

Our Selly Oak campus, two miles from Edgbaston, is a green 80-acre site with a village atmosphere. We also have a satellite campus in the historic town of Stratford-upon-Avon (the Shakespeare Institute).

The School of Dentistry is located at the Birmingham Dental Hospital at Pebble Mill, which is less than a mile from the main campus. It is the first stand-alone, integrated dental hospital and dental school to be built in the UK for almost 40 years.



GUILD OF STUDENTS

The Guild of Students plays an important role in our students' lives. With over 400 student groups, societies and associations, the Guild helps our students to develop skills, have fun and get the most from their time at Birmingham. The building is a hub of activity, with shops, a bar, food and drink outlets and support services hosted here.





OUR RESEARCH FACILITIES

We continually invest in resources and improve research facilities to ensure our postgraduate researchers are able to pursue their ideas and transfer their knowledge. We have an extensive range of labs supporting innovative research in 21st-century disciplines such as robotics, gene therapy, human biomaterials and hydrogen gas fuelling.

THE STUDENT HUB

TEACHING AND LEARNING BUILDING

NEW DEVELOPMENTS

Our Edgbaston campus is currently seeing major developments in terms of its teaching and study facilities. Our new Teaching and Learning Building is a hub for education, providing lecture theatres and space for 1,000 students to carry out group or private study. The newly opened Collaborative Teaching Laboratory features labs and practical teaching spaces for STEM subjects, along with a state-of-the-art School of Engineering building opened in 2020.

We offer over 100 sports scholarships, 55 student sports clubs, over 150 fitness classes a week and flexible membership options.

WELCOMING WORLD-CLASS ATHLETES

Birmingham is one of the UK's leading sporting universities. We have a reputation for providing a world-class training environment on our Edgbaston campus, not only for our own international student-athletes but for Team Jamaica who trained here ahead of the London 2012 Olympic Games and the IAAF World Championships in 2017.

Off campus, the Raymond Priestley Centre in the Lake District provides the opportunity to try a host of outdoor activities, including sailing, windsurfing, mountaineering, rock climbing, kayaking and canoeing. We also have access to the nearby Edgbaston Reservoir and a boathouse in Worcester (on the River Severn).

There are over 55 different sports clubs to choose from. From badminton to volleyball, there's something for everyone to get stuck into. Whether you're a beginner or already

playing sport at a national level, joining one of our sports clubs is the perfect opportunity to discover your sporting passion.

COMMONWEALTH GAMES 2022

Our new squash courts and hockey pitches will become competition venues during Birmingham 2022, following the city's successful bid to host the Commonwealth Games, meaning our staff and students can look forward to welcoming world-class athletes to campus once again.

THE BARBER INSTITUTE OF FINE ARTS

Major works from celebrated names in the history of Western art, such as Botticelli, Monet and Van Gogh are included in our outstanding art collection at the Barber Institute. We have been praised as 'the last great art collection of the twentieth century' and 'one of the finest small galleries in Europe' (*The Observer*).

SPECIAL COLLECTIONS AND ARCHIVES

Built up over a period of 120 years, our Special Collections and Archives consist of approximately 200,000 pre-1850 books dating from 1471 and some 4 million manuscripts, all of which distinguishes us as a major UK research library.

THE LAPWORTH MUSEUM OF GEOLOGY

The Lapworth Museum dates back to 1880 and is one of the oldest specialist geological museums in the UK. The Lapworth Museum provides a valuable resource for students, schools and colleges, research workers, enthusiasts and anyone with a desire to learn about geology.

The Research and Cultural Collections include extraordinary artefacts, from West African masks in the Danford Collection to important 20th-century paintings such as Peter Lanyon's mural in the Arts Building.

THE BRAMALL

The Bramall is home to our Department of Music, which boasts two symphony orchestras, a jazz orchestra, new music ensemble, choirs and many other groups that regularly perform at The Bramall. Seating 450 and featuring world-class acoustics, the main auditorium provides an intimate environment for enjoying everything from comedy nights to classical music evenings.

AND THAT'S NOT ALL!

Many of our facilities on campus offer the opportunity for classes, workshops and tours, making the campus a hub for learning and exploring.

We offer our postgraduate students the opportunity to develop their language skills, either for personal development or to support their studies, via our open access language courses, all of which are taught on campus with convenient day or evening sessions.

We also host several large events each year, such as our Birmingham Prom and Community festival, alongside graduation balls, alumni events and international conferences. CAREERS SUPPORTFOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

GRADUATE ROUTE - POST-STUDY VISAS

The UK Government has announced the reintroduction of the post-study work visa.

This will be available to international graduates wishing to stay and work in the UK after studies, who graduate from 2021 onwards.

If you are eligible, the new visa will allow you to work for two years after completing your Masters degree in any subject, or up to three years if you have completed a PhD.

The new student route will provide greater flexibility, including the ability to switch visa types from within the UK, a longer application window for students to submit their visa application, and removing study time limits at postgraduate level.

MASTERS-LEVEL TAUGHT PROGRAMMES

These are usually one year in length (and a minimum of two years if taken part-time). Comprising a number of modules, they are assessed by a combination of coursework, examination and dissertation, and lead to the award of a Masters qualification.

Our taught Masters programmes are the next step after undergraduate study and can be pursued to further your knowledge and expertise, to prepare for a research degree, to gain a vocational qualification or even to change careers.

DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS

We offer a new education route bringing together university study and the invaluable, on-the-job training typical of an apprenticeship. Level 7 (postgraduate) degree apprenticeships support lifelong learning and are suitable if you want to take your career to the next level through Continuing Professional Development (CPD) opportunities.

WHICH PROGRAMME SHOULD YOU CHOOSE?

TYPES OF TAUGHT COURSES AVAILABLE

You will accumulate 180 credits in each full year of study on a Masters-level course. Credits are acquired by taking compulsory and optional modules, with each 20 credit module equivalent to 30-35 hours' learning per semester. This is delivered through a combination of independent study and contact time in lectures and seminars. Modules may be based around a single subject or a small part of a much broader area.

WHICH PROGRAMME SHOULD YOU CHOOSE?

MASTERS-LEVEL RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

A combined research and taught Masters,

such as the MRes, is often taken as a stepping stone to doctoral study. These combined programmes will provide you with taught modules to increase your knowledge of a subject, and the opportunity to complete an extended research thesis with the appropriate training and supervision.

A research Masters, such as the MSc by Research, is a good way to investigate a topic in greater depth, to prove your capacity for undertaking research and/or to demonstrate your suitability to progress to a doctoral degree.

DOCTORAL RESEARCH PROGRAMMES

These involve the completion of original academic research. They also include research skills training that will equip you to become an independent researcher, capable of advancing knowledge in your field.

Doctoral degrees, such as the PhD, are the highest level of academic qualification, for which you will conduct original research and make a contribution to a field of knowledge. Doctoral researchers often teach undergraduate classes during their degree programme and you will usually contribute to the research life of your department by presenting papers at seminars and conferences.

DECIDE YOUR MODE OF STUDY

Flexibility in the mode of learning enables you to undertake learning and assessment through different methods and formats. On some of our courses, you can choose which mode of study you take, whether it is campus-based, block delivery, blended or distance learning. Some courses are offered by more than one mode and you may be able to transfer from one mode to another.

FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME?

Although full-time study is still the most common choice for our students, we know that many of our postgraduates, for professional, family or financial reasons, prefer to take their degree course on a part-time basis, either on campus or through distance (online) learning. Some of our programmes now offer these options. Please note that due to visa restrictions, international students (currently those from non-EU/EEA countries) studying on campus are normally only eligible for full-time study.

DISTANCE LEARNING?

If you have commitments that don't allow you to study via the standard on-campus mode, or you prefer an online learning format, then you may like to consider applying for a distance learning programme (a mode of study that is sometimes also referred to as distance education). The main advantage of studying by distance learning is its flexibility. You can study at home, in your own time and at your own pace, so you can combine achieving a qualification with work or family commitments.

RESEARCH PROGRAMMES AT BIRMINGHAM

Our research programmes involve the completion of original academic research, or a piece of scholarship, which you will conduct under expert supervision from a Birmingham academic. You will also be supported by a thriving academic community of internationally renowned research staff and talented research peers, alongside research skills training.

ROUTES INTO RESEARCH AT BIRMINGHAM

You have the opportunity to pursue research at either Masters or doctoral level through our suite of programmes and qualifications, depending on your background and career plans.

There are, generally, two routes to a Birmingham research degree:

You can apply to an 'advertised PhD', which means it is part of an established research project and is usually funded by the University or other funding body. Generally, advertised PhDs are associated with the physical and life sciences subjects. Some advertised PhDs will be pre-defined but some may require you to propose your own research.

Apply to any of our PhD programmes and propose your own research that is 'self-funded' (by you, a sponsor, or other sources not explicitly attached to the PhD on application). Usually you submit a research proposal and identify your proposed supervisor. These are generally associated with the arts and social sciences.



FEES, FUNDING AND SCHOLARSHIPS FOR YOUR MASTERS

We understand that continuing your education to postgraduate level is a significant financial commitment. We aim to provide you with information on all the associated costs so there are no surprises once you begin your course.



WHAT DOES IT COST?

Tuition fees for your course

Tuition fees vary depending on the course you choose and whether you are a home (UK) or an international student. Taught Masters programmes generally cost an annual fee of at least £9,500 with some programmes costing more. You can find details of the tuition fees for individual courses on our website.

How to pay your fees

You can choose to pay your tuition fees in full or make monthly or termly instalment payments using the University direct debit scheme from a UK bank account on our website.

POSTGRADUATE MASTERS LOAN

The Postgraduate Masters Loan is available to all UK students and those joining us from Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland can also access Masters loans through their respective governments. The loan is usually a contribution towards the cost of study and is available across all subject areas for full-time, part-time and distance learning Masters programmes, as long as you don't already have a Masters qualification (or equivalent).

MASTERS SCHOLARSHIPS

We support our students to flourish in their careers, providing subject and University scholarships, as well as providing you with support on alternative ways to fund your degree.

Our Birmingham Masters Scholarship is our flagship award of £1,500 for more than 300 students. We award this each year to the best candidates, to ensure we welcome the brightest talent for postgraduate study.

RESEARCH COUNCIL **FUNDING (UKRI)**

There are seven government-funded research councils, known jointly as UKRI (United Kingdom Research and Innovation) that offer financial support to postgraduate students:

- AHRC (Arts and Humanities Research Council)
- BBSRC (Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council)
- ESRC (Economic and Social Research Council)
- EPSRC (Engineering and Physical Sciences Research Council)
- MRC (Medical Research Council)
- NERC (Natural Environment Research Council)
- STFC (Science and Technology Facilities Council)

WHAT DOES IT COST?

Tuition fees for your course

Tuition fees are charged annually. We use at least the minimum fee level recommended by UKRI for our research-level fees. The fee level for 2021-22 is £4,500. You can find your course fees on our website or in the course directory. There may also be additional costs associated with field trips, travel and undertaking research off-campus.

How to pay your fees

You can choose to pay your tuition fees in full or make monthly or termly instalment payments using the University direct debit scheme from a UK bank account.

FEES, FUNDING AND SCHOLARSHIPS FOR YOUR RESEARCH DEGREE

POSTGRADUATE DOCTORAL LOAN

The Postgraduate Doctoral Loan is a new government loan that you can use to help with course fees and living costs. UK nationals who normally reside in England can borrow up to £27,265 if your course starts on or after 1 August 2021, that will be divided equally across each year of your course. Your course can be full- or part-time and last between three and eight academic years.

Funding support for PhD study can be provided in different ways, with some covering the programme fees and including a stipend (maintenance costs), while others may simply be a one-off financial award.

Your first consideration for funding should be our advertised PhDs, UKRI (United Kingdom Research and Innovation) or the many funding bodies listed on our Postgraduate Funding database.

There are two main ways to fund your PhD:

Apply for a PhD that already has funding attached. These are most common in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Medicine) subjects, but they can sometimes be available for pre-defined research projects in the arts, humanities or social sciences. These may be advertised as fully funded (with fees and a stipend) or competition funded, meaning the projects compete against other projects at each institution. Self-fund, or search for funding or a studentship once you have an offer.
You devise your own PhD topic, find a supervisor, write a research proposal and apply to the relevant programme. If you're offered a place at Birmingham, you can then apply for studentships or funding from various sources. International students

If you require a visa to study in the United Kingdom, you will need to apply by 1 July 2022 for programmes starting in September 2022. We are not able to consider applications for these programmes made after this date.

YOUR DOCUMENTS

All documents must be in English or have a certified translation. If you provide documents by uploading them into the online postgraduate application system (found through course finder) and are made an offer, you will be required to send certified copies or original documents as a condition of the offer.

We recommend you supply all of the following documents at the point of submitting your application to ensure that there are no delays:

- Your academic transcripts and any other supporting material
- If not submitted within the application form, a personal statement explaining why you are interested in studying your chosen programme
- If required, additional information to be submitted such as a CV or a sample of work (this will be stated within the application form)
- If English is not your first language, a certificate to show competency in the English language will be required (see next page)
- Your research proposal (if required)

If the University makes you an offer, and you decide to accept it, a contract will be formed between you and the University.

The website includes important terms, conditions and requirements that will apply to that contract, and on which the University will rely in its future relationship with you. It is essential that you read them carefully.

Information set out in the prospectus and on the University website is accurate at the date of publication (September 2021).

ENTRY **REQUIREMENTS**

To gain a place at Birmingham, you will need to meet the specific entry requirements for your chosen course.

Our postgraduate programmes usually require a good Honours degree (normally a 2:1 or above), or an equivalent qualification if you were educated outside the UK. There may also be additional requirements, such as prior or practising work experience.

If you are applying for a PhD, then you may also need to hold a good Masters qualification, however, for some programmes, this may not be a requirement.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE COURSES

If you do not have the required level of English, you can enrol on one of our presessional English programmes before the start of the academic year, delivered by our Birmingham International Academy. Passing the appropriate programme means you will automatically meet the English language requirements of your offer and can progress to your academic studies here.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

If your first language is not English then you will need to demonstrate that you have a high level of written and spoken English by providing evidence of an English language qualification. Certificates should be no more than two years old at the time of admission. The table below details the IELTS or TOEFL scores you will need but we also accept other qualifications.





APPLY TO PROPOSE YOUR OWN RESEARCH

You can propose your own research rather than joining an existing research project. You will need to submit a research proposal to conduct a unique piece of research and identify your proposed supervisor. Funding can be found from other sources such as scholarships, charities, loans and self-finance. Generally, these PhDs are associated with the arts and social sciences.
