Terms and Conditions

- 1. Technical, annotated or electronic dictionaries will not be permitted.
- 2. Dictionaries must be conventional only
- 3. Technical, encyclopaedic or electronic dictionaries are not permitted.
- 4. Dictionaries must not contain any additional material, such as a thesaurus, synonyms, images, graphs, lists of countries, or measurements
- 5. All dictionaries must be 'clean' meaning there should be no hand written notes, highlighted areas or page markers of any kind.
- 6. Use of a dictionary does not cover language examinations, except where the dictionary is being used as an intermediate step for example it would be permissible for a native French speaker completing a Spanish examination to use a French/English dictionary.
- 7. Dictionaries cannot be used during exams where the question paper specifically forbids their use.
- 8. Failure to produce the letter during an examination sitting may constitute an Examination Irregularity.
