


In all cases, if you need to resit in the summer this will be possible. It will take the form of one or more pieces of inclusive online assessment.



You are doing a full-time, one year MA/MSc programme or you are in your second year of a part-time PGT programme.

You are doing a part-time PGT programme and in your first year.

You are doing a PG Diploma or a Graduate Diploma.

You are doing a PG Certificate or a Graduate Certificate.

The University's emergency adaptations to the regulations mean that you will complete 140 credits rather than 180. This will come from 80 taught credits and 60 project/dissertation credits. (If your programme has a regulatory body your programme team will advise you on how this affects the below for you).

You will need to have the best 40 credits out of 60 credits of taught modules (this is what is normally delivered in the first year). You also need to have met the Programme Learning Outcomes.

You have successfully completed a minimum of 80 credits from submitted (or due to be submitted) assessments across all taught modules AND have met the Programme Learning Outcomes.

You have NOT YET successfully completed a minimum of 80 credits from submitted (or due to be submitted) assessments across all taught modules and/or met the Programme Learning Outcomes.

You will need to have successfully completed 40 credits out of the 60 credits of taught modules AND have met the Programme Learning Outcomes. The best 40 credits will be taken to give you your course classification.

You have successfully completed a minimum of 80 credits from submitted (or due to be submitted) assessments AND have met the Programme Learning Outcomes.

You have NOT YET successfully completed a minimum of 80 credits from submitted (or due to be submitted) assessments OR have NOT YET met the Programme Learning Outcomes.

The second year will count towards the degree as normal (including the 60 credit dissertation or project).

Your 80 credits (or best 80 credits if you have more available) will be used to give you a course classification.

You will be required to complete one or more pieces of inclusive online assessment. This will contribute to the modules that are missing marks (up to the 80 credit threshold) and/or meeting the Programme Learning Outcomes.

If you have not yet got 40 credits, you will be required to complete one or more pieces of inclusive online assessment. This will give you marks up to the 40 credit threshold and/or ensure you meet the Programme Learning Outcomes.

You can continue completing your project/dissertation worth 60 credits with no additional assessments.

You will be required to complete one or more pieces of inclusive online assessment. This will contribute to the modules that are missing marks (up to the 80 credit threshold) and/or to meet the overall Programme Learning Outcomes.

You will not need to make up the 20 credits from first year and can continue to the second year.

Your 80 credits will be used to give you a course classification.

Your degree classification and overall weighted mean mark will use your best (highest scoring) final year 140 credits (including all the marks for the 60 credit project/dissertation).

You can progress to completing your project/dissertation worth 60 credits.

If you do not complete a dissertation (or fail and fail the resit), then you can be awarded a PGDip on the basis of 80 credits of taught modules, or a PGCert on the basis of 40 credits of taught modules
