Your Visa

Do you need to extend your Tier 4 visa?

The IST provides information to help you prepare your documents. We provide workshops where we can guide you through the process and have your documents checked at the same time.

You should start this process as early as possible - we recommend that you start preparing three months before your visa expires.

Police Registration

We sympathise with you that it is very difficult to get an appointment with the Police however, they are very busy and early appointments get booked very quickly. Our advice to you is:

- You must persevere with trying to get an appointment as you need to have your police registration, so, keep trying;
- Alternatively, the University Police Officer is based in University Centre (in the food halls near to Spar) and if you go there they may be able to help you.

Immigration updates

Graduate Visa (Post Study Work)

You may be aware that the UK Home Office has announced plans to offer a two year visa after your studies and will allow you to work in the UK for up to two years.

At this moment in time the informaiton on this is limited but we expect that it will be available from 2021 to any students who graduate in 2021 onwards.

You and your visitors can attend your graduation ceremony by applying for a Standard Visitor Visa.

I am inside the UK and my Tier 4 visa expires before my Graduation ceremony – what visa should I apply for?

You cannot extend your Tier 4 visa to attend your graduation ceremony as a Tier 4 (General) student visa is for individuals who are currently studying.

If your visa is due to expire before your graduation ceremony you will have to leave the UK and return/enter the UK with a/as a standard visitor visa.
